

Editor's Comment:

- I agree with the peer reviewers' report and the response given by the authors are convincing.
 - But to my personal opinion: taking into consideration the history of treatment in a primary health center with timely extensive fasciotomy, repeated several sittings of extensive wound debrima for 2 weeks and then referral to higher center: this case is not fitting with the diagnosis of '*primary cutaneous mucormycosis*', rather it looks more like a prima face case of severe necrotizing fasciitis with subsequent nosocomial mucormycosis which is more possible in a primary health centre level. This case could have been referred earlier to the tertiary care center. This fact has been highlighted by the authors in the conclusion. But still '*primary cutaneous mucormycosis*' is fitting diagnosis; it has to be relabeled suitably: '*Delayed recognition of secondary mucormycosis in a severe case of necrotizing fasciitis resulting to death of the patient*'.
 - Authors are requested to go through the authors' guidelines in the SDI and AJCRS websites.
 - Authors to recheck for spelling and grammar mistakes.
 - Abstract (not more than 250 words) of the Case reports should have the following sections: Aims, Presentation of Case, Discussion, and Conclusion.
 - Replace the keywords with 4-8 fresh ones in MeSH terms in alphabetical order other than those found in the title.
 - Acknowledgements, conflict of interest among authors and contribution level of each author must be mentioned.
 - Institutional ethical committee clearance details (or at least ethical waiver report) must be furnished.
 - Verbal informed consent is not sufficient. Written consent either in the AJCRS format or the authors, institution format is a must.
 - References are not up to date.
 - The references list should be in Vancouver style. For full details on this refer to the following link to university of Queensland (<http://www.library.uq.edu.au/training/citation/vancouv.pdf>)
 - The titles of journals should be abbreviated according to the style used in Index Medicus as per NLM Catalog: Journals referenced in the NCBI Databases and must be in italics.
 - Use the complete name of the journal for non-indexed journals.
 - et al. has to be used only if the number of authors exceeds 6.
 - *Please also see the authors' guidelines in AJCRS website.*

May be accepted after all corrections and suggestions are carried out by the authors.
