For Authors

- Methodology is the systematic, theoretical analysis of the methods applied to a field of study. It comprises the theoretical analysis of the body of methods and principles associated with a branch of knowledge. But you have developed a method. You are not considering different methods. Change Methodology to Method.
- Why do you use underlining? This is not allowed in scientific articles.
- At the end of the Introduction, please write the aim of the article.
- Table (page 3): Please enter a unit. Please enter some reference for data.
- Please do not write in bold. This is unnecessary. Change everywhere. Use the same name in one scientific article.
- Please decide if you will use abbreviations. The rule is that the full name is given for the first time, and the abbreviation in brackets. This abbreviation is still used in the text. You constantly mix and enter full names and provide the next abbreviation in brackets. Please harmonize it.
- The description of the Table or Figure in the text must be ahead of the Table or Figure.
- The results lack the justification that your method is better. Method validation is missing. It would be good to provide comparative results for two different methods.
