While the object of the study is interesting, MAJOR REVISION is mandatory before considering the manuscript for publication:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Revise your complete manuscript for proper English (for example, "occured" must be changed in "occurred"; "romatoid" in "rheumatoid"); punctuation must be improved, too.</li> <li>2. In the Introduction, the definition of MRONJ must be reported. I think that you can find a complete definition in the AAOMS position paper on MRONJ of 2014 (Ruggiero SL, Dodson TB, Fantasia J, Goodday R, Aghaloo T, Mehrotra B, O'Ryan F; American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons. American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons position paper on medication-related osteonecrosis of the jaw--2014 update. J Oral Maxillofac Surg. 2014 Oct;72(10):1938-56)</li> <li>3. To date, not only Bisphosphonates but even several different drugs have been described as related to MRONJ occurrence (denosumab, bevacizumab, infliximab, adalimumab,...).
